ENTRY


This cause originated in this court on the filing of a complaint for a writ of mandamus.

Upon consideration of respondent's motion to dismiss, it is ordered by the court that the motion to dismiss is denied.

It is further ordered by the court, sua sponte, that respondent shall file an answer to the complaint within 14 days from the date of this entry.

It is further ordered, sua sponte, that an alternative writ is granted and the following schedule is set for presentation of evidence and filing of briefs pursuant to S.Ct.Prac.R. 12.05:

The parties shall file any evidence they intend to present within 20 days from the date of this entry; relator shall file a brief within 30 days of the date of this entry; respondent shall file a brief within 20 days after the filing of relator's brief; and relator may file a reply brief within 7 days after the filing of respondent's brief.
